



We continue our journey through Lent and into Holy Week this month. The following is a schedule of mid-week and Holy week services. Our Wednesday services begin with soup suppers at 6:30 followed by worship at 7:15. Maunday Thursday and Good Friday worship is at 7:00 PM.

March 7 – GOD'S WILL and MY IDENTITY – Mary – In humility, Mary dutifully accepted the role God had given her to become the mother of our Savior. That Son would later accept his roll, faithfully following the path his Father had in mind for him to save us all.

March 14 – GOD'S WILL and MY WORLD VIEW – Paul – On the road to Damascus, Paul had his worldview turned upside down when God called him to preach the name of the Christ he had been persecuting. We follow God's will by putting the crucified Christ at the center of our worldview.



Community Food Cupboard coupons

The Community Food Cupboard in downtown Rochester serves a large senior community, as well as others in emergency situations as they arise. We (The Women of the ELCA) feel that this program is another way that Our Saviour can do God's work within the community.

I will send in coupons collected on a weekly or biweekly schedule. The Food Cupboard uses the coupons to buy the products and then distributes the products to their clients. We need to watch expiration dates carefully, thus the weekly or biweekly mailings. Coupons requested include: canned goods (especially soups, as well as vegetables and fruits); peanut butter (they stressed this product); cereal products and dairy products. A box for the coupons is located on the table in the narthex.

Equal Exchange orders will be taken on Sunday, March 11

As reported in the January newsletter, since its' inception in 1996, the products available for sale by Equal Exchange has increased tremendously. There are whole bean and ground coffees, percolator coffees, single serve cups, organic coffees, decaffeinated coffees and flavored coffees. There are 14 types of black, green or herbal teas. There are 3.5 oz. chocolate bars, mini chocolates, candy bars, chocolate chips and cocoas. There are natural and roasted almonds and cashews, dried fruits (mango, pineapple and raisins) and three types of fruit and nut bars, as well as honey, marmalade, strawberry jam, trail mix, rice cakes and extra virgin olive oil!

Stop by the table in the narthex between services on **March 11** to check out the catalog and place your order. We do need to order in case lots, but individuals can join together to order a case. The number of items per case is noted in the catalog. Purchases are typically available on the following Sunday between services. You pay for your purchase upon receipt.




Palm Sunday is March 25. This day, also known as The Sunday of the Passion, celebrates Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem. The crowds proclaimed Jesus king as they spread branches of palm and shouted praises to God. Our morning Services at 9:00 and 11:15 AM will include the Distribution and Blessing of Palms and The Passion of Our Lord.

The Youth of the congregation will once again serve breakfast this morning in place of the Easter breakfast.

MAUNDY THURSDAY is March 29. Holy Communion is celebrated at 7:00 PM. On this day Christians gather to share in the holy supper Christ gave the church to reveal his unfailing love for the human family. Jesus demonstrates this love by speaking his faithful word and giving us his body and blood. We realize that as Christ's followers we are sent to continue Jesus' actions in daily life: to serve those in need, to offer mercy, to feed those who are hungry.

This night Holy Communion will be around a table set at the front of the church. We remember Jesus and his disciples gathering for this meal as we gather in groups of 12 to receive the sacrament. Distribution is by Individual Cup. This service also concludes with a focus toward Good Friday in the Stripping of the Altar.



On **GOOD FRIDAY**, March 30, Service of Tenebrae at 7:00 PM. the people of God gather to hear the proclamation of the passion, to pray for the life of the world and to meditate on the life-giving cross. The ancient title for this day – the triumph of the cross – reminds us that the church gathers to offer thanksgiving for the wood of the tree on which hung our salvation. Through scripture readings, hymns, the extinguishing of candles and gradual dimming of the sanctuary lights we focus on the crucifixion of Jesus in this powerful and moving service.



"You must date and identify everything that's goes into the refrigerator and freezer especially if you want to stay the owner of such items. Periodically we will check and purge any unmarked items if they look bad or spoiled. Also, it is very important that we keep the top three shelves cleared for supporting events that may occur periodically like funerals and special church celebrations. As an ongoing mission, Women of ECLA plan to act boldly in their faith by providing food and toiletries for St. Theodore's, a local food pantry in Gates. Deb Housel has volunteered there for 8 years, and she will be transporting the food collected at LCOS to the Cupboard.

St. Theodore's Food Cupboard began in 1982 and is run completely by volunteers. Located in two classrooms of the former school building at 168 Spencerport Road, its entrance is accessible from Dunn Tower Drive. The Cupboard serves two types of clients: monthly and emergency. Sixty families are supported in the monthly program. These families receive 3 bags of food each month. To become a monthly client, a person must go through a personal interview and disclose finances to demonstrate a true need. This qualification process is repeated annually, so the monthly client list changes as clients' fortunes improve.

Between 30 and 50 families each month request emergency food. They are given a 3-5 day supply of food and a small bag of toiletries. St. Theodore's serves people living in the 14606 and 14624 zip code area, but will not turn away anyone outside that area. If a person comes and says s/he needs food, food is *always* given. No appointment is necessary, but proof of ID and address are required. People are strongly discouraged from declaring an emergency more frequently than every three months, and records are kept to prevent abuse of the system. The Emergency Food Program hours are: Monday 12-2 p.m., Wednesday 11-1 p.m., Thursday 10-12 p.m. Emergency clients are informed about social service programs (such as food stamps) and given the paperwork to apply for them.

Who are the people who rely on St. Theodore's Food Cupboard? You might be surprised. It's within walking distance of Dunn Tower, and some of the elderly living there couldn't make ends meet without it. It's often the working poor. Sometimes it's someone who's been laid off at age 57 and told to use up her entire 401K before she can qualify for food stamps.

To help, bring your donations to church and leave them in the wicker basket below the table in the Narthex. There's a Women of ELCA sign on the table above the basket. If the basket is full, terrific! Just pile your groceries nearby for Deb to collect.

St. Theodore's receives help from Foodlink and New York state. As a result, it must follow guidelines about offering healthy foods. Here's a list of the items most needed:

Note: Household cleaning supplies (laundry soap, dishwashing liquid, paper towels, etc) are *not* distributed.

St. Theodore's is the only food cupboard in the Gates area, and due to the economic climate, in the past four months there has been a significant increase in clients. If you have any questions, you can email the director, Kathy Nicol, at knicol7@rochester.rr.com.
