All: A new age is dawning, and death cannot harm us. God of all


creation, we praise you . God of resurrection and eternal life, we have gathered in this garden to worship you and celebrate your

Gathering Prayer

Deacon: The Lord be with you.

You call us to go into the world to share this Good News and because we are not left alone, we can join in confidence our confession and hear words of forgiveness.

Easter Gospel: John 20: 1-18

Deacon: The Holy Gospel According to John.


All: Glory to you, O Lord.

Early on the first day of the week, while it was still dark, Mary Magdalene went to the tomb and saw that the stone had been removed from the entrance. So she came running to Simon Peter and the other disciple, the one whom Jesus loved, and said, "They have taken the Lord out of the tomb, and we do not know where they have put him!" So Peter and the other disciple started for the tomb. Both were running, but the other disciple outran Peter and reached the tomb first. He bent over and looked in at the strips of linen lying there, but he did not go in. Then Simon Peter who was behind him arrived and went into the tomb. He saw the strips of linen lying there as well as the burial cloth that had been around Jesus' head. The cloth was folded up by itself, separate from the linens. Finally, the other disciple, who had reached the tomb first, also went inside. He saw and he believed. (They still did not understand the scripture that Jesus had to rise from the dead). Then the disciples went back to their homes. But Mary stood outside the tomb crying. As she wept, she bent over to look into the tomb and saw two angels in white, seated where the body of Jesus had been, one at the head and the other at the foot.

They asked her, "Woman, why are you crying?" "They have taken a way my Lord," she said, "and I do not know where they have put him." At this, she turned around and saw Jesus standing there, but she did not realize that it was Jesus. "Woman," he said, "why are you crying" Who is it you are looking for?" Thinking he was the gardener, she said to him. "Sir, if you have carried him away, tell me where you have put him, and I will get him." Jesus said to her "Mary!" She turned toward him and cried out in Aramaic "Rabboni!" (which means Teacher). Jesus said, "Do not hold on to me, because I have not yet returned to the Father. Go instead to my brothers and tell them. 'I am returning to my Father and your Father, to my God and your God." Mary Magdalene went to the disciples with the news, "I have seen the Lord". And she told them that he had said these things to her.

Deacon: Let us pray.

We give thanks, O God, that through the water and the Holy Spirit, you give us new birth, cleanse us from sin and raise us to eternal life. Stir up

in us the gift of your Holy Spirit: the spirit of wisdom and


understanding, the spirit of council and might, the spirit of knowledge and the fear of the Lord, the spirit of joy in your presence, both now

temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, and

the power, and the glory, forever and ever. Amen.
