From The Desk of Pastor Wilck



"We are like members of a choir which is singing together unaccompanied; possibly we do not know each other very well, and we are not used to singing together. Gradually, though we do not hear it, we drop lower and lower, then the choirmaster has to give a little toot on his pitch pipe to remind us of the level at which we ought to be singing.

The note on which our lives are being lived is dropping all the time, and we don't notice it. We need a sudden and urgent reminder, pull us up sharply, as the choirmaster does when he sounds his pitch pipe. We need something to pull us together and help us to screw the note of our lives up again.

That is why in any period for thought and prayer, such as lent provides, it is far more important to turn our minds to God than it is to consider ourselves. The pitch pipe we shall use will be the consideration of our Lord's passion. When we consider him during this supreme moment of his life on earth, we shall see how far the note of our lives has dropped; at once we shall begin to start afresh and try to sing in tune with him."

The above is an excerpt from a little essay entitled CONSIDER HIM written by Olive Wyon. I love the image of the pitch pipe because often we can slip out of pitch so easily and not even notice it. Throughout my ministry among you I have sought to blow the pitch pipe when needed to get us back on track. As I am laying my ministry aside in several months I recognize that other people will be blowing the pitch pipe. Of course some of them will be from the upstate New York Synod helping you and directing you to define your mission and seeing where you want to head in the years ahead, that is the blowing of the pitch pipe.

If I were to have one final toot on the pipe it would be to lift up to you the possibility of a ministry that can and should be developed in our congregation. I earnestly believe that one mission would be to move forward with our music ministry as a tool for growth. We have seen some very good advances and our choir and bell choir. To that end the church council has accepted a proposal to pursue the replacement of our piano in the sanctuary and develop a program of music ministry that reaches into our community. I believe this is very doable and should be done as it will open our doors to a variety of opportunities for music and outreach.

Above all, all that we do, should be in praise and worship of our Lord and savior Jesus Christ, without that we simply become another Rotary Club. We are not that, we are the church, and as such we share in our Lord's passion as he seeks to redeem and call us to be his very own. He also sends us out to call others that we might share that good news of life and resurrection with them. Should we fail to do that then my 21 years among you has been for naught.

Indeed, the church council and you as the congregation will have several opportunities to blow the pipe and share your ideas of mission and ministry in this place. That is very healthy and should be done. "Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the father and of the son and of the Holy Spirit and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age," (Matthew 28:18-20).

May you continue to teach, preach, reach out with this gospel message to a desperate world knowing that God is with us.

St. Theodore's Food Cupboard April Mission Collection

In January the church council voted to reduce the amount of mission collections down from 5 in 2024, and to focus instead on 2 organizations, Loop Ministry and St. Theodore's Food Cupboard.

So for the month of April we will be collecting funds from the congregation for St. Theodores' Food Cupboard.

St. Theodore's Food Cupboard serves residents in the 14606 and 14624 zip codes. They are open for emergencies, Mondays, Wednesdays, and Thursdays from 10:00 a.m. till 12:00 p.m. They provide a four of five day supply of food which includes staples, frozen meat and fresh fruits and vegetables based on availability.

In addition, they have a monthly program for families who need help on a regular basis and who qualify following an interview process. The bulk of the food comes from food link and the remainder come from donations made by churches like ours. The organization is entirely staffed by volunteers.

Envelopes will be made available beginning in April and we encourage you to give generously!

Thank you to all the dedicated and amazing volunteers that continue to volunteer monthly making 200 PB&J sandwiches for St. Peter's Kitchen. We continue to meet the second Thursday of each month at 9:30 am in the Augsburg Room. The next batch of sandwiches will be made on Thursday, April 10 at 9:30 a.m. There is a sign-up sheet on the table in the Narthex. It will only take about an hour of your time!

We are now making 25-30 additional sandwiches monthly for the group, "People Helping People," for the Homeless and Homeless Veterans in Rochester, NY. These sandwiches are distributed directly to the



homeless people in Rochester. This month, we plan to make 25 Easter goodie bags filled with water, chips, two PB&J sandwiches, a granola bar and cookies and maybe jellybeans too.

Steve Brady volunteers once a week at St. Peter's Kitchen and he encourages anyone interested to join him in volunteering.

During the month of April, our CHURCH MISSION is for St. Theodore's Food Pantry. We continue to collect food items throughout the year for St. Theodore's Pantry as well.




