
From The Desk of Pastor Wilck



As I reflect on the upcoming month I am aware that it is the month of our annual meeting. Sometimes Christ's light Shines brightly during these Epiphany deliberations, but sometimes the light is dimmed by all the human shortcomings. We expect too much. We want our own way. We question the budget and worry about empty pews. Instead of gathering to celebrate Christ's presence among us and his resurrection, we seem to stand weeping at the cross

As I turn to the lessons for the third Sunday after the epiphany and read them one by one I came up with some other reflections that might impact our congregational meeting.

I recognized Jeremiah, that worried, reluctant young man, faced with God's call and reaching for excuses—" why me Lord?" And then I saw him bowled over, pulled along God's fantastic promise of steadfast love and unheard of power to turn his world upside down.



In first Corinthians 12, I recognized the church: a careful hierarchy of talents and responsibilities, a diverse community gathered and transformed—"the body of Christ" (12:27)

I turned to Luke 4 and almost laughed at a congregation that wasn't even satisfied with Jesus! At first, they were all well impressed with his speaking. But then he went too far, angered the pious synagogue community, and they threw him out.


I turned back to first Corinthians 13. I thought I knew it well but I read it again, thinking of my diverse congregation, full of energetic strong minded people." Love is patient, love is kind; Love is not envious or boastful or arrogant or rude.... It bears all things, believes all things,: hopes all things, endures all things" (13:4,7)

We call chapter 13 a beautiful hymn to love, but surely it's more than that. It shows us what can happen when we let God's love move in and through us. It describes God's love and our love—the love that unfolds these pews, the people who are in them, and the people who are not. It speaks of the love that awaits for all people on this altar, in this cup. It is a love that not only waits, but pursues, until we let go of pettiness and faithlessness and excuses and, knowing that we are loved, risks accepting and loving others

Finally, Paul says, there are faith, hope and love. Faith allows us to be Christ's hands, feet, eyes, and ears in this world. In hope, God can work through us in this very human institution, the church. And it is love, especially at the congregational meeting that lifts us up binds us together, and sends us out.

The Church & Community Committee will be meeting in March to discuss upcoming events in 2025.


