Below is an update of the income and expenses for May and Year to date as of 5/31/24. Although expenses exceeded income in May we are still ahead by \$26,618.88 YTD. At the end of May with 42% of the year behind us our income YTD was at 58% of the forecasted annual income and expenses were at 39% of budgeted expenses.


Summer Worship submitted by the office


