

### A Farewell Message

As this is my final newsletter article to you, there are a few things I want to share. Spending the past 21 years with you has been both a joy and a privilege. You have stood with me through good times and hard times. I will always



remember your love and care following the loss of my son and again during my cancer diagnosis. Through all the years, my love for you has only grown.

As we prepare for new chapters, let me offer a brief outline of what lies ahead. In the first weeks or months, supply pastors will lead worship. The Bishop assures me that they will aim for consistency, with just one or two regular supply pastors.

An interim pastor will also be appointed. This person will guide you through the transition and provide pastoral care. During this time, the call committee will be formed to help identify your next pastor. They'll evaluate community demographics, budget, mission vision, and the leadership style best suited for your future.

Expect to explore questions like: What kind of leader do we need? What theological perspective is fitting? What is the congregation's mission today?

Remember, this is a deliberate and important process. Skipping or rushing through it will not serve you well. Candidates will want to see an active and engaged church, not one on pause.

Above all, trust God, who never abandons the church but empowers it to proclaim the gospel.

Before I go, let me lift up one final mission I hope you'll consider. A fund has been established for the purchase of a new and larger piano in the sanctuary — a tool to enhance our music ministry and outreach. A better instrument could open the door to concerts, choirs, and community engagement. I encourage you to support this fund.

You are a strong, vibrant congregation. God has placed you here for a reason. May God bless you in this next season.

### FROM MAINTENANCE TO MISSION



Today's congregations face a vital challenge; moving beyond maintenance into mission.

Here are some distinctions between maintenance churches and mission churches:

- Measuring effectiveness: Maintenance asks, "How many pastoral visits were made?" Mission asks, "How many disciples were made?"
- Facing change: Maintenance says, "Let's avoid upsetting people." Mission says, "If this helps reach outsiders, how can we not?"
- Vision: Maintenance says, "Be faithful to our past." Mission says, "Be faithful to the future."
- Focus: Maintenance churches focus on members. Mission churches focus on the culture around them.
- Leadership style: Maintenance is managerial. Mission is transformational.
- Conflict: Maintenance avoids it. Mission sees it as a byproduct. of growth.

Mission congregations aren't afraid to walk "off the map." They aim to understand and reach the unchurched. They burn energy not to save themselves, but to reach the warld.

It's not an easy shift, but it is the way forward.


