Pastor: And now let us turn our attention to the Advent Wreath. Let us pray.


(The first candle of the wreath is lit by members of the Blank family while the prayer is being read)

the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.

Old Testament: Isaiah 63:16b-17; 64:1-8

Lector: A reading from the first book of Isaiah.

For you are our father, though Abraham does not know us and Israel does not acknowledge us; you, O LORD, are our father; our Redeemer from of old is your name. Why, O LORD, do you make us stray from your ways and harden our heart, so that we do not fear you? Turn back for the sake of your servants, for the sake of the tribes that are your heritage.

O that you would tear open the heavens and come down, so that the mountains would quake at your presence — as when fire kindles brushwood and the fire causes water to boil — to make your name known to your adversaries, so that the nations might tremble at your presence! When you did awesome deeds that we did not expect, you came down, the mountains quaked at your presence.

From ages past no one has heard, no ear has perceived, no eye has seen any God besides you, who works for those who wait for him. You meet those who gladly do right, those who remember you in your ways. But you were angry, and we sinned; because you hid yourself we transgressed. We have all become like one who is unclean, and all our righteous deeds are like a filthy cloth.

We all fade like a leaf and our iniquities, like the wind, take us away. There is no one who calls on your name, or attempts to take hold of you; for you have hidden your face from us, and have delivered us into the hand of our iniquity.

Yet, O LORD, you are our Father; we are the clay, and you are our potter; we are all the work of your hand.

Reflection

Pastor:

O Lord, please come. Come to a world that is dying without you. Come, even though we tremble at your coming since all our righteousness is as filthy rags. Come as the Sun of Righteousness, risen with healing in your wing. Come, fill our world, Come, use us to make your own holy dreams come true. We are the clay, you are the potter; we are all the work of your hand. You, O Lord, are our Father. Our Redeemer from of old is your name.

Epistle: 1 Corinthians 1:3-9

Lector: A reading from Paul's letter to the Corinthians.

Lector: Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

I give thanks to my God always for you because of the grace of God that has been given you in Christ Jesus, for in every way you have been enriched in him, in speech and knowledge of every kind — just as the testimony of Christ has been strengthened among you — so that you are not lacking in any spiritual gift as you wait for the revealing of our Lord Jesus Christ. He will also strengthen you to the end, so that you may be blameless on the day of our Lord Jesus Christ. God is faithful; by him you were called into the

fellowship of his Son, Jesus Christ our Lord.

Help us to trust that we do not lack any spiritual gift as we wait for your coming. Help us to trust that you will keep us strong to the end. And so, faithful Lord, come to us and use us to reveal yourself to all of those for whom you died. Help us to live as those who watch with a purpose. Come in your own good time, for we do not know the day or the hour. Come, as indeed you once came. "Oh, come to us, abide with us, Our Lord, Immanuel."



The Nicene Creed




Living together in trust and hope, we confess our faith.

by your cross and suffering; by your death and burial: Help us, good Lord.


By your resurrection and ascension;

in the hour of death; and in the day of judg-ment: Save us, good Lord.






