

### Blessing and Lighting of the Advent Wreath

Pastor: "God of power and mercy open our hearts in welcome. Remove the things that hinder us from receiving Christ with joy so that we may share his wisdom and become one with him when he comes in glory, for he lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, forever and ever. Amen"

All: As we wait for your plan to unfold, give us the patience we need. Remind us of the peace we can access when we take time to pray and remember that you are God. Help us to find rest in the midst of what feels like chaos in our world. Amen.

Pastor: Praise be to the LORD God, the God of Israel, who alone does marvelous deeds.



Pastor: And now let us turn our attention to the Advent Wreath. Let us pray.

(The second candle on the wreath is lit by the newly married Mr. Andrew & Mrs. Shannon Krupnicki, while the prayer is being read)

Pastor: Because of war, because of violence in our communities, because there is still so much unrest in our hearts, we light a candle of peace.

All: Because hatred is still so strong, because so many swords have not yet been beaten into ploughshares, we light a candle of peace.

Pastor: May the light from this candle overwhelm the world.

All: May the light from this candle declare to the world that God's peace is coming, on earth as it already is in heaven.

Pastor: Friends, be not afraid, God's peace is at hand!

All: Amen.

#### **Confession and Absolution**

Pastor: Hear what our Lord Jesus Christ says: "Love the Lord your God with all your

heart and with all your soul and with all your strength. This is the first and great commandment. And the second is like it: "You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' All the law and the Prophets hang on these two commandments!"

only to you. In the name of Jesus Christ I ask forgiveness. Deliver and restore me


that I my rest in peace.

Pastor: Almighty God in his mercy has given his Son to die for you and for his sake he


forgives you all your sins. As a called and ordained servant of the Word I therefore forgive you all your sins in the name of the Father and of the †Son,

All: Amen.






# **Kyrie**

Pastor: The Lord be with you.

Pastor: Let us pray.

All: Stir up our hearts, O Lord, to make ready the way of your only-begotten Son that at his second coming we may worship him in purity; who lives and reigns

with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. Amen.

(You may be seated)

#### Old Testament: Isaiah 40:1-11

Lector: A reading from the first book of Isaiah.

Comfort, O comfort my people, says your God. Speak tenderly to Jerusalem, and cry to her that she has served her term, that her penalty is paid, that she has received from the LORD's hand double for all her sins.

A voice cries out: "In the wilderness prepare the way of the LORD, make straight in the desert a highway for our God.

Every valley shall be lifted up, and every mountain and hill be made low; the uneven ground shall become level, and the rough places a plain.

Then the glory of the LORD shall be revealed, and all people shall see it together, for the mouth of the LORD has spoken."

A voice says, "Cry out!" And I said, "What shall I cry?" All people are grass, their constancy is like the flower of the field. The grass withers, the flower fades, when the breath of the LORD blows upon it; surely the people are grass. The grass withers, the flower fades; but the word of our God will stand forever.

Get you up to a high mountain, O Zion, herald of good tidings; lift up your voice with strength, O Jerusalem, herald of good tidings, lift it up, do not fear; say to the cities of Judah, "Here is your God!"

See, the Lord GOD comes with might, and his arm rules for him; his reward is with him, and his recompense before him.

He will feed his flock like a shepherd; he will gather the lambs in his arms, and carry them in his bosom, and gently lead the mother sheep.

Music Director: Oh really? What's that about?

Lector: Well, listen to what it says:

"But not forget this one thing, dear friends: With the Lord a day is like a thousand years, and a thousand years are like a day. The Lord is not slow in keeping his promise, as some understand slowness. He is patient with you, not wanting anyone to perish, but everyone to come to repentance. But the day of the Lord will come like a thief. The heavens will disappear with a roar; the elements will be destroyed by fire, and the earth and everything in it will be laid bare.

Since everything will be destroyed in this way, what kind of people ought you to be? You ought to live holy and godly lives as you look forward to the day of God and speed its coming. That day will bring about the destruction of the heavens by fire, and the elements will melt in the heat. But in keeping with his promise we are looking forward to a new heaven and a new earth, the home of righteousness.

So then, dear friends, since you are looking forward to this, make every effort to be found spotless, blameless, and at peace with him."

Lector: What do you think of that?

Music Director: I think it's kind of weird. Doesn't it scare you?

Lector: No, not really. I used to think so before I became a Christian.

But now I have a relationship with God, so I don't need to be worried.

*Music Director*: Really? How does a relationship with the Lord help you not worry?

Lector: I used to think a lot about it, and I was worried because I couldn't

understand every single word of the bible. But now I realize that even though I don't have all the details about what will happen, I know the guy who wrote the book, and I know he loves me and will take care of

me.

*Music Director*: So you are perfectly content to wait for God to do all the things he has

promised to do?

Lector: You bet, I just wish I had gotten started sooner, waiting for God.

Hey look, I think Pastor might be finally ready to read the Gospel.

Music Director: Well, it's about time! Hey, what time is it anyway?

Lector: It's time for the Gospel reading. And it's right on time.

# The Gospel Reading: Mark 1:1-8

Pastor: The Holy Gospel of Our Lord According to Mark.

All: Glory to you, O Lord.

Pastor: The beginning of the good news of Jesus Christ, the Son of God.

As it is written in the prophet Isaiah,

"See, I am sending my messenger ahead of you, who will prepare your way; the voice of one crying out in the wilderness: 'Prepare the way of the Lord, make his paths straight,'" John the baptizer appeared in the wilderness, proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. And people from the whole Judean countryside and all the people of Jerusalem were going out to him, and were baptized by him in the river Jordan, confessing their sins. Now John was clothed with camel's hair, with a leather belt around his waist, and he ate locusts and wild honey. He proclaimed, "The one who is more powerful than I is coming after me; I am not worthy to stoop down and untie the thong of his sandals. I have baptized you with water; but he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit."
