#### Pastor's Corner—2023 Synod Assembly Recap

The 2023 Synod Assembly gathered at Bethany Baptist Church in Syracuse, New York June 2-3 with the theme G.R.A.C.E. Mindset: Restorative Justice. We worshiped, sang, prayed, laughed, cried, shared time together in conversations and at meals, learned about Restorative Justice practices, welcomed guests, received reports, and took actions of the work of the church together. Highlights included:

- The Keynote Address by The Rev. Amy Reumann, Senior Director for Witness in Society who focused our assembly on what Restorative Justice looks like in the criminal justice system, and what God's reconciling and restorative justice looks like in the church.
- A Combined "Conversation" with the Racial Justice and Gender Justice Task Force Facilitators The Rev. Kwame Pitts and The Rev. Tonya Eza sharing how justice work is a part of what it means to be the church for the sake of the world, today.
- The "Bee-Generous" World Hunger Campaign raised thousands of dollars (final report to be shared by the Hunger Justice Team) for World Hunger including designated funding to support Honeybees and community gardens in communities living with food scarcity. Special thanks to Melissa "Bee" and the whole committee for their hard work.
- Engaging workshops assembly Winter Kits, learning about Racial and Gender Justice, and Advocacy with the ELCA and New York State Council of Churches.
- The celebration of the UNYS Discipleship Award recipient, Maureen Gensler. Maureen is the chair of the Hunger Justice Committee and member of Lord of Life Lutheran Church, Depew, NY.
- The celebration of significant congregation anniversaries and the anniversary of ordination of many of our rostered leaders.
- Many wonderful reports including from United Lutheran Seminary, Seafarer's Ministry, Atonement Lutheran Church and The Barbara Macholz Grimaldi Legacy Fund, Lake Chautauqua Lutheran Center, The Women of the ELCA, the ELCA Foundation, ELCA Fund for Leaders, New York State Council of Churches, New Mission communities, and Synod Staff.
- The approval of the 2024-2025 Mission Proposal
- Elections: Pastor Andrew Nelson was elected to Synod Council from the Hudson Mohawk Conference, Gary Roller was elected to Synod Council from the Genesee Finger Lakes Conference. Atif Dean was elected to Synod Council to serve in one of two, at-large seats designated for a person of color or whose original language is other than English. Will Platnick was elected to a lay position with the Discipline Committee.
- Resolutions approved included a resolution permitting Ministers of Word and Service to serve as a
  Conference Dean, providing Synod Assembly voting privileges to Assigned Synod Authorized Ministers,
  creating a designated at-large Synod Council seat for a person who identifies as LGBTQIA2S+, and
  supporting New York State legislation addressing the debt crisis for developing nations through the
  New York Taxpayer and International Debt Crises Protection Act.

The Church & Community Committee is sponsoring a churchwide drive for Maggie's Place Summer Camp Program 2023.

The Camp will begin on July 5 and run for six weeks. We are asking the congregation for donations of summer toys, flip flops, swimming items, towels, snacks, etc. The camp will have approximately 60 children ranging from ages 3-14. We are also asking for cash donations to help defer the cost of renting buses.

PROVIDING PEANUT BUTTER AND JELLY SANDWICHES FOR THE HOMELESS SHELTERS IN THE CITY OF ROCHESTER.

St. Peter's Kitchen at 681 Brown Street provides meals for five shelters in the city for approximately 250-300 people five days a week (Mon-Fri). However, since they are not open on the weekends, they provide meal bags for the shelters. Each meal bag consists of a PB&J sandwich, cheese snack, raisins, cookies and nuts. At this time, St. Peter's Kitchen is in need of churches providing the sandwiches. We would like to have our church provide sandwiches once a month.

St. Peter's Kitchen will provide us with the peanut butter, jelly and baggies. We would only have to provide the bread. As a trial basis, we would like to provide a one-time donation of 100 sandwiches and see how it goes. If all goes well, we can make it a more permanent monthly commitment. This is a great opportunity for our church to help our city's homeless community.
