## Jubilees Summer Picnic submitted by Deb Ciccone





#### Monthly Statistics for April



#### **Households Served**

- 182 Households Served: 283 adults, 167 children and 63 seniors
  - ⇒ 683 Bags of groceries distributed
  - $\Rightarrow$  14 bags of groceries were given out on Saturday 3/25/23.
  - ⇒ 33 households served on Tuesdays vs. 99 on Thursdays.

#### **Financials**

- Received a donation from The Lutheran Church of Our Saviour for \$4,372.
- We collected 3091 pounds of soft goods and 226 pounds of hard goods as a result of the Savers Clothing Drive. We will receive \$697.82 into our account.

#### Refrigerator update

• Foodlink HPNAP capital equipment application has been submitted for a refrigerator. Awaiting determination from them to proceed with purchase.

#### **Facilities**

 We are losing use of Jenny Lind Room where we store the filled grocery bags and many other pantry supplies. We propose clearing out part of the Loop office which would create a much-needed storage space.

#### Grants

Rob Little gave an update on the NYS grant application, and he is almost ready to submit for a freezer. He is also looking into a couple other opportunities.

#### Foodlink:

- Received Shrimp in April that was a huge success. Produce boxes will continue to arrive in May and June
- Foodlink can designate pantries to become retailer partners. This allows access to unsold food. Approval is pending.
- Lori has established an informal agreement with Village Bakery on Culver Rd. to pick up unsold items at the end of the day.
- Lori and Patty attended the Foodlink conference on April 25th. It was a great networking and information gathering opportunity.

#### **Volunteers**

- Lois Dannenberg was kind enough to repair and paint our ramp that is used to roll our carts out to customers' cars.
- A case worker for Rochester Safe Court came to the pantry and is interested in partnering with us to assist trafficked individuals with food.
- We have a new volunteer, Dan Finnerty, who started with us on Tuesdays. He is willing to pick up food from any retailers we are assigned by Foodlink or developed by us.
- Maryanne Townsend has volunteered to help write letters we can send to retailers for specific needs.

A member congregation of the Upstate New York Synod Evangelical Lutheran Church in America A church goer wrote a letter to the editor and complained that it made no sense to go to church every Sunday.
