

Pastor's Page

Leaves have changed their color. Most of them have been mulched or bagged. The garden is about finished for the season and most of the crops are in. This time of year has special significance.

In the Old Testament times, portions of the crop were brought into the sanctuary. Thank offerings were a means to express gratitude to the God who provided everything.

Corn shocks in the corner of the sanctuary and cornucopia on the altar remind us of God's creation that provides us with food and fuel. Those symbols also remind us of the heritage that extends back thousands of years.

Every Sunday, when our tithes and offerings are placed on the altar, the ancient tradition is remembered. We no longer bring bushels of corn or chicken to the altar. We bring money. We have moved from a world of bartering to a world of cash exchange. But the idea is still there. It is a way of saying: "Thank you, God."

On November 10th we will not only bring our offerings but also our estimate of giving cards. It is commitment Sunday. It is a day to say thank you to God and because of our faith we commit to giving in the year to come.

We come to church for many reasons. One of them is to give thanks to God for all of God's goodness. Our response of giving and commitment is a continuing way to give thanks to God for all his benefits. Please join us on November 10th and share your commitment to God and the ministry of Our Saviour.

Simply Giving Program – Did you know that there is a convenient, safe, and simple way to make regular church offerings without the need to write checks, carry cash, or prepare envelopes? Our church participates in the Simply Giving program provided by Thrivent. It works the same as automatic payment methods used by many families for paying bills. 


ELCA members in more than 9,300 congregations in the United States and Caribbean give approximately \$1.75 billion in regular offering to support ELCA ministries in their local communities and worldwide. When members give through their **congregations**, a percentage of that money is then shared with the local **synod** and the national **churchwide organization**.

Of these unrestricted gifts, the churchwide organization receives around 2.6 percent. This represents the largest portion of the ELCA churchwide organization's operating budget.
