There will be an altar guild meeting on Saturday, September 30th at 10:00 a.m. All members are encouraged to attend as well as anyone who wants to know more about serving on the Altar Guild.

On August 15, Daryl Jarvis, Debbie Frey and Cheryl Stone began a project to clean out the toddler room, which is located down the stairs across from the Reformation Chapel. This room had been relatively untouched since the closing of the daycare. There were quiet a few items in the cupboards that needed to be relocated to better homes including; office items, religious supplies, as well as Sunday school items. Some items were no longer of value and needed to be thrown away. Several items were identified that could be donated to a nursery of daycare school including some small children's furniture.

Over the years several groups in the church have used the Choir room for overflow storage. Most recently items from the choir room and offices from Reformation Church were also put in the choir room with little to no organization. Over the summer Jonathan has worked merge the music and other choir items from Reformation as well as items that were still in boxes from when Reformation merged with St. Lukes many years ago. In order to accommodate this, groups that were using the choir room for storage like WELCA and the Altar Guild were asked to find alternative storage for their items.


